I. GENERAL INFORMATION

LOCATION AND DATE

The Jamboree will be held on November 6 - 8, 2026 at Boxwell Scout Reservation: 1260 Creighton Lane, Lebanon, TN 37087. All times referenced in this Guide are Central Time.

REGISTRATION AND COSTS

Registration for the 2026 Council Jamboree will be available on the Middle Tennessee Council Black Pug Registration site beginning April 15, 2026. *All registrations will be collected as a unit, not an individual.* Lone scouts or those participating without a unit may register individually. You are responsible for adhering to Safeguarding Youth guidelines at all times.

The cost to attend the 2026 Council Jamboree is \$25.00 per Cub Scout, Scout BSA, Venturer, or Sea Scout when paid by October 1, 2026. Leaders will be charged \$10.00 if paid by October 1, 2026. After this date, the cost for scouts will be \$30.00 and leaders will be charged \$15.00 to attend. The Staff cost is \$25.00.

ARRIVAL AND CHECK-IN

Please be aware that there will be a 10 day out meeting on October 27, 2026 via Zoom for Cub Scout Packs at 6 PM and for Scouts BSA units Zoom meeting starting at 7 PM. These meetings will help to ensure all units are aware of arrival procedures, campsite assignments, vehicle placard information and other vital communications. It is the responsibility of the unit leader to disseminate this information to those attending the event. Any additional information will be available to the leader that registered the pack or unit.

Any unit bringing a trailer with them to camp will need to plan to drop it off either Wednesday or Thursday between 8 AM and 9 PM or Friday before 11 AM if you want it to be in your assigned camping spot. No vehicles/trailers will be allowed into the camping areas at check-in after Friday at noon.

On Friday, November 6, all vehicles entering camp should arrive with their dash placard information in their window as provided at the 10 day out meeting. Failure to follow this procedure will delay your entry into camp.

Units cannot be guaranteed campsites next to other specific units, though efforts will be made for units that are officially linked. All units should Be Prepared and work out all Safeguarding Youth protocols prior to arrival. Coordination with other units in the sub-camp area may be required. Cub Scout parking will be located near the designated camping areas. For older Scouting units, cars will not be allowed into the camping area. Attendees need to be prepared to carry their personal gear. We will have drop zones in the parking area for unit gear that will be transported to a central location in the camping area.

PARKING

Parking will be allowed in designated areas only. Each unit will be allowed one vehicle, physically attached to a unit trailer, in their campsite if brought in on Wednesday or Thursday. This vehicle must remain parked until departure on Sunday after check-out has been approved. **Any extra vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense. Roads must remain open at all times to allow access by emergency vehicles.**

No RV's (motorhomes, camping trailers, or campers) are allowed and will be refused entry. No personal ATV's, golf carts, bicycles, scooters, roller blades, or wheelies will be allowed. Please carpool to conserve parking.

CAMPSITES AND ASSIGNMENTS

Campsites will be pre-assigned by Jamboree staff based on unit pre-registration numbers. Each unit will have a designated area marked for use. Please respect the boundaries set for your unit and do not encroach on neighboring units. We will do our best to accommodate any additions to your unit who may have decided to attend after pre-registration closes. If there are space conflicts that cannot be amicably resolved, contact your sub-camp commissioner.

Unit campsites should be organized and maintained in accordance with Scouting America guidelines. Individual units are responsible for all of their camping equipment and supplies. Generators will not be allowed in campsites. Guarantees cannot be made for access to power. Please plan ahead for portable batteries for electronics like CPAP machines. Smoking in the sub-camp areas is prohibited. The U.S. flag, Tennessee flag, and unit or patrol flags are encouraged to be displayed in unit camp sites. Please use appropriate flag etiquette when displaying flags.

TENTS

All tents should be anchored to the ground and placed in a neat order within the assigned camp space. All tents must be within the assigned campsite number and leaders' tents should have the leaders name posted on the front of the tent for quick identification in case of an emergency. Each unit will be responsible for their unit's duty roster and other responsibilities the unit has within their campsite. Valuables should be kept at home or locked in a vehicle. The Middle Tennessee Council and Jamboree staff are not responsible for lost, stolen or misplaced valuables.

Separate tenting arrangements for adult males and females and youth males and females are required. Youth sharing tents must be no more than two years apart in age. In Cub Scouting, parents and guardians may share a tent with their family. Spouses may share tents. In older Scout programs, parents and youth must tent separately. As an exception, a parent or guardian may share a tent with their own child if they are of the same sex.

CHECK-OUT AND DEPARTURE

Check-out is any time after Sunday morning's "Scouts Own Service," but no later than 12:00 pm. No units may depart until after their campsite has been inspected and they are cleared to leave by sub-camp staff. If a unit needs to leave prior to Sunday morning, they will need to make arrangements to have their campsite inspected and complete the electronic Jamboree evaluations. Final packets will only be given to units once the camp inspection and evaluation have been completed.

Unit leaders will need to use the checklist provided at the Friday night leaders' meeting to ensure all tasks have been completed prior to requesting sub-camp staff to approve departure. Many units will be trying to leave within a short period of time. Please remain patient as the sub-camp staff will do their best to approve your unit for departure. Check-out will include the following procedures:

1. Final Campsite Inspection: Your sub-camp staff will come to your campsite when its ready for a final inspection. Your unit must wait at your campsite until after it has been verified that all your gear is packed and the area has been patrolled for trash.

2. Evaluation Forms: The Jamboree evaluation form will be on the Jamboree APP and must be submitted prior to check-out on Sunday. These evaluations are essential for us to create an ever-improving event. If you feel changes need to be made to future Jamborees, or if you want to praise a specific staff member, please include those comments in your evaluation.

UNSCHEDULED ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Anyone arriving or departing from the Jamboree, at any time during the weekend, must sign in and out at Jamboree Welcome Area located at the Crab Building. We need to be aware of any changes in attendance for all adults and youth at the Jamboree in the event of an emergency.

MANDATORY LEADERS MEETING FRIDAY NIGHT

On Friday, November 6 once arriving at its campsite, each unit will be expected to set up their campsite. At 10:00 pm, there will be a mandatory leader meeting for the unit leader or his or her designated assistant at the sub-camp headquarters tent. For units arriving Saturday morning, information will be provided when you arrive.

At this time, units will receive pertinent information for the weekend's events. Safety protocols will be reviewed and any special bulletins regarding changes to the program or schedule updates will be provided. Staff will answer any questions or resolve any issues. If additional staffing assistance is required, units may be asked to volunteer.

JAMBOREE APP

A Jamboree APP is being developed to provide participants and guests with information at their fingertips such as a map of the Jamboree footprint; daily schedule of events and locations; emergency contact information; sub-camp service needs; Jamboree Evaluation Form; and more. More information about the Jamboree App will be shared prior to the Jamboree.

JAMBOREE STAFF

The Jamboree staff is made up of dedicated volunteers from across the council who have contributed significant time and effort to ensure a successful event. They are available to answer questions and welcome your feedback on how to enhance the participant experience.

Our volunteer staff is committed to being fair, consistent, and reasonable in all activities and interactions. Their goal is to help create a safe, enjoyable, and memorable weekend for everyone involved.

We strive to foster an environment that is welcoming and inclusive for all participants. Your cooperation and understanding are greatly appreciated, especially when staff members need to take action or make a command decision in the interest of safety and fairness.

JAMBOREE PATCHES

Each registered youth and adult leader will receive a Jamboree participant patch at the end of the weekend. These patches will be delivered to your unit upon completion of the check-out process/final inspection. Additional patches for parents or other attendees may be available for purchase at the on-site Trading Posts while supplies last.

CHANGES AND EVENT CANCELLATION POLICY

Our Council refund policy states, “If an activity is cancelled or postponed by our council or a district and the participant cannot attend on the alternate date, the full fee will be refunded.”

Refund of fees, outside of a \$50.00 deposit, will be processed on a sliding scale according to the following guidelines:

- Requests received 30 or more days before the event – will receive 100% of the total event fee, less a non-refundable deposit. (Non-refundable deposit covers administrative materials/equipment.)
- Requests received 14-29 days before the event – will receive 50% of the total event fee, less a non-refundable deposit.
- Requests received from 13 days before until the day of the event – will receive 50% of the total event fee, less a non-refundable deposit, only in the event of medical reasons (with a health care professional’s verification), a death in the immediate family, or a natural disaster.

No refund requests will be accepted after 10 days following the end of the applicable activity.

Approved refunds will be processed within 30 days of their receipt in writing and made by check, at the discretion of Council staff, to the original payer for individual registrations; or for the unit, in care of the reservation contact, for group reservations.

LOST AND FOUND

Items found are to be turned in at Camp Headquarters located on the back side of the Harwell Leadership Center. Lost items may be claimed at HQ. Items not claimed by the conclusion of Jamboree will be sent to the Nashville Scout Office.

UNIFORMS AND DRESS CODE

Full field uniforms (Class A) are to be worn during the opening ceremony, Centennial Show, and religious services. Activity uniforms (Class B) consisting of a unit t-shirt or other appropriate attire must be worn at all other times.

TRADING POST

The Jamboree will have an online order form available to pre-order Council Jamboree merchandise. The Pre-Order Form is the only way to guarantee purchase of select commemorative Jamboree merchandise and will be available on the Council website or link from the Jamboree App. The Jamboree Trading Post will be opened in late July and will close end of September for Pre-Orders. For your convenience the Trading Post will accept cash, checks, and credit cards. Pre-Orders may be picked up at the Scout Shop at the Council Office or at the Jamboree on-site Trading Post.

The on-site Trading Post will offer limited Council Jamboree merchandise along with many other collectibles, assorted camping supplies, and other fun items as long as inventory lasts.

FOOD TRUCKS

The Jamboree will feature several food trucks and snack vendors on-site on Saturday to provide alternative meal options from mid-morning to mid-afternoon on... Confirmed vendors will be listed in the Jamboree information area on the Jamboree App, Council website and shared at the 10 day out Zoom meetings. Cash or cards accepted.

SUB-CAMP COMMISSIONERS

Each of the four sub-camp areas (2 for Cub Scouts and 2 for Scouts BSA/Venturing/Sea Scouts) will have a pair of commissioners and concierge staff to assist with arrival and departure for the Jamboree. Sub-camp commissioners and concierges will be on-site as you arrive and their contact information will be given at that time.

All sub-camp areas are subject to unannounced inspections at any time by sub-camp commissioners. Inspections will be completed to maintain health and safety standards throughout the Jamboree for the benefit of its participants and visitors.

II. HEALTH AND SAFETY

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Jamboree emergency procedures will be covered at the 10 day out meetings as well as the Friday night leaders' meeting. Emergency contact information will also be listed on the Jamboree App.

FIRST AID

Units should provide their own first aid kit and have it visible and available to be used if need arises. In the event of injury or sickness, please report directly to a sub-camp headquarters tent, program area staff member, or any general staff member. These individuals will radio to emergency services for assistance. If the sick or injured person is able to walk to the first aid station located *inside* the Harwell Leadership Center, please take them directly to that location. For life-threatening emergencies, call 911, give the operator the camp's location (1260 Creighton Lane, Lebanon), then immediately notify Jamboree staff.

MEDICAL FORM AND MEDICATIONS

Every Scout and adult attending the Jamboree must have a completed Scouting America medical form Parts A & B on site. Electronic copies are not a substitute for physical forms. Unit leaders will keep their medical forms in an organized binder. Unit leaders will need to provide medical forms in the event of an emergency. It is highly recommended that the unit review the forms for completion prior to arrival. (Part A-Consent signed. Part B: Insurance information, at a minimum, provide the year of the last tetanus shot, approval/denial of over-the-counter medications). Any acute medical conditions are required to be reported to medical staff upon arrival.

Those persons with diabetes or allergies must provide their own emergency kits and be prepared with proper medication. Medications MUST be kept with unit leadership in a safe location. Also, any medications requiring refrigeration (e.g., insulin) must be stored with the unit.

The Guide to Safe Scouting requires all attendees to complete Part A and Part B of the medical form. All attendees include parents, youth, staff, and unit leaders. Part C is only for activities lasting longer than 72 hours and is not needed for the Jamboree.

ACTIVITY CONSENT FORM

Every youth under 21 years of age must have Part A: Informed Consent, Release Agreement and Authorization of the Medical Form signed by parents/ guardians, giving permission to participate at the event and for any medical treatments, hospitalization, etc.

SCOUTING AMERICA INSURANCE

Units should keep in mind that only registered Scouts and adult leaders are covered by the Scouting America Insurance policy. This is secondary coverage to the individual's primary insurance. The role of the Scout leader is to provide a safe and quality program for the Scouts. Any non-registered participants in attendance are responsible for themselves.

HAZARDOUS WEATHER AND LIGHTNING

All Scouts and adults should pack and prepare to come and participate at Jamboree, rain or shine. Bring tents, ponchos, pack covers, dining flies, ground cloths, and necessary clothing to be comfortable in case of rain. Units are expected to have trained members in inclement weather camping procedures. Guidance on lightning will be provided during the Friday night leaders' meeting.

PARTICIPANT IDENTIFICATION

All participants for the weekend must wear, on their wrist, a provided ID band. Bands will be distributed at the sub-camp leaders' meetings on Friday night. Unit leaders need to legibly write on each wrist band: 1) The unit number (P125, T23, C511, S1000); and, 2) the phone number of the on-site leader for the weekend with access to the health forms.

SAFETY

Leaders must ensure that all participating in Scouting activities abide by the Scout Oath and Scout Law. Adult leaders and youth members share the responsibility for the safety of all participants in the program, including adherence to Safeguarding Youth and health & safety policies.

Adult leaders are responsible for monitoring behavior and intervening when necessary. All Safeguarding Youth guidelines must be followed at the Jamboree. Units will need to work together in certain situations to ensure there are two registered adult leaders with youth at all times.

The buddy system should be used at all times.

WALKING ON RESERVATION

Walking on the roads at Boxwell is restricted. Please consult the Jamboree App and designated markers and travel by trails for everyone's safety.

USE OF ELECTRONICS

Scouts may bring cell phones to the Jamboree, provided their unit permits them. Several STEM-related activities will require the use of a smartphone for participation. We ask that all other electronic devices—such as tablets, radios, televisions, portable gaming systems, and similar items—be left at home. Any personal property brought to the event is the sole responsibility of the individual. The use of smartphones, cameras, mirrors, drones, or similar devices in areas or situations where privacy is expected is strictly prohibited.

QUIET HOURS

All activities will be subject to quiet hours and lights out from 11:00 pm until 7:00 am each day. Leaders in each unit are responsible for enforcing these hours. A Scout is Courteous. After Taps, every Scout is expected to be in his or her tent and quiet at that time. If you must move about in your own area after Taps, do so quietly so that others are not disturbed. Roaming about the campgrounds or other campsites during quiet hours will not be tolerated.

RESPECTING OTHER UNITS' SITES

Please follow good camp etiquette. Everyone should respect other units' campsites. Please do not cross through another unit's site, instead participants should walk around. While we encourage Scouts to visit other units, please announce your arrival and ask permission to enter before walking into a site. Show others the level of courtesy that you would like to be shown.

SANITATION AND BATHROOMS

All units should plan to have a hand washing/sanitizing station setup within their site. All Shower House/Bathroom facilities at camp will be available during the Jamboree and additional Porta Potty's will be available too. Please respect the gender designation of all facilities at Boxwell Scout Reservation. Make every attempt to keep them clean. Do not place trash in the toilets. All units share in the responsibility of keeping the facilities clean and in working order. Please inform the staff of any issues immediately so it can be corrected before it becomes a major problem for all. It is a good idea to bring a few rolls of toilet paper with your unit and have campers take one with them to the toilets, just in case.

COOKING AND FIRES

Wood fires will be allowed in burn barrels only and permitted based on weather conditions/burn bans/input from Wilson County and Boxwell Ranger. If your unit has their own burn barrels, please bring them to use. The camp has a limited number of burn barrels to use. Liquid fuel, propane stoves, and charcoal may be used in accordance with Scouting America policy. All use must be above ground. The Jamboree will follow the principles of "Leave No Trace." Coal ashes must be carried away with you--no dumping of ashes anywhere at Boxwell. Gas or liquid fuels are to be handled by adults only and stored away from tents and open flames/sparks. **Fire prevention must be top priority.**

Each unit or individual is responsible for their own meals. All food should be stored in animal-proof containers and food areas kept clean when not in use to avoid attracting wildlife. It is up to the individual units to bring their own cooking and cleaning equipment. Units will cook in their own campsite. All cooking areas should be a minimum of 10 feet away from all tents and other combustible materials. It is strongly suggested that time constraints of the Jamboree schedule should be kept in mind when planning meals. Units need to plan for meals to be simple and easy to clean up so participants can spend the maximum time participating in Jamboree activities. Units are responsible to bring ice coolers to maintain their food safely during the weekend.

WATER

Drinking water will be available at stations across the Jamboree. Containers will be needed to carry water to the campsites. No dish washing, bathing, or hand washing will be allowed at these faucets. Please do not waste water. Each Scout should come to the Jamboree with a water bottle to carry during the Saturday activity sessions. Camp Bathrooms/Showers will be available.

TRASH

All trash should be placed in designated garbage area located throughout the sub-camp areas. Scouts leave an area cleaner than they found it. **Recycling will be available.**

PROHIBITED ITEMS

Prohibited items include, but are not limited to:

- **Alcohol:** In accordance with Scouting policies, no alcoholic beverages, drugs, or other controlled substances will be allowed to be present or consumed at the Jamboree.
- **Firearms/Weapons:** For safety reasons, personal firearms, pellet guns, BB guns, bows and arrows, or slingshots of any kind are not allowed at the Jamboree.
- **Fireworks:** Absolutely NO fireworks are permitted at Boxwell Scout Reservation.

PERSONAL PETS

No personal pets or emotional support animals are permitted at the Jamboree. Service animals are permitted, per ADA guidelines, for campers with disabilities. A service animal is defined as a dog or miniature horse that is trained to perform a specific task for its handler.

III. ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

What an incredible weekend of activities we have planned! From group competitions to Scout skill challenges, and from interactive displays to exciting demonstrations, the Jamboree promises to be the pinnacle of fun in Middle Tennessee.

Activities will be organized into age-appropriate areas and arranged in an open, state fair–style layout. Participants can jump into their favorite Scouting activities or explore the many exhibits and demonstrations throughout the day—bringing back fresh ideas and inspiration to share with their units.

Jamboree activities will include branding, a scavenger hunt, passport games, robotics, STEM experiences, crafts, and a Cub Scout inflatable area, along with Cub range and target activities. There will also be plenty of friendly competition, including Scout costume contests, Unit Banner contests, an Adult Dutch oven cook-off, an Adult Checkers tournament, and much more. MIDWAY

Anchored by the Americana Stage, it will feature a wide range of music and entertainment, displays from community agencies and businesses along with engaging displays and booths from EMS, Police, Fire Department, and Military Personnel. At the center of the Midway, our council and national scouting programs will be featured along with vendors focused on serving scouting. The Midway will also provide meaningful service opportunities, including a food drive, blood drive, and the chance to explore a TEMA response bus—plus much more. Come out and discover everything Scouting has to offer and find out how you can get involved!

TRADE-O-REE

Trade-O-Ree's are events held for the primary purpose of trading, buying, and selling Scout memorabilia. The Trade-O-Ree will be set up in the Harwell Leadership Center and will feature Scouting collectors from around the nation. Be sure to stop by and see some great patches, neckerchiefs, and other Scouting pieces. You are welcome to bring your collection if you want to make a trade. Adults are prohibited from buying or selling patches with youth. Monitors will be onsite to oversee action and to prevent any unscrupulous transactions.
