#1	Meetings: Units hold meetings with scouts at least twice per month during the school year. Annually, Packs hold a blue and gold banquet and Troops hold a minimum of two Courts of Honor.	☐	
#2	Leadership: A minimum number of trained and registered leaders are required. (The unit Key 3 and three additional committee members, each den has a registered and trained Den Leader or each patrol has one registered and trained Assistant Scoutmaster	☐	
#3	Training: 60% of all leaders need to have completed position specific training requirements, with at least one registered leader completing Messenger of Safety (MoS) basic and at least one registered leader MESH Level 1 trained.	☐	
#4	Membership: Packs have a minimum of 20 registered youth. Troops have a minimum of 12 registered youth. The unit renews at least 65% of eligible youth and has an increase in membership annually. Packs and Troops work together to host an opportunity for AOLs to visit with a Troop.	☐	
#5	Outdoor Activities: Units must participate in a variety of outdoor experiences. For Packs, a minimum of 4 outdoor activities annually including 2 overnight camping activities. 50% youth participation across these activities. For Troops, a minimum of 6 overnight camping activities including at least one long-term camp with 50% youth participation.	☐	
#6	Advancement: Units achieve 40% rank advancement for their active Scouts.	☐	
#7	Service Projects: Units conduct/participate in at least 3 service projects annually. A project benefiting the charter partner; a Scouting America project (Service to local schools, Scouting for Food or Memorial Day Flag placement); and one additional project. Have an average of 50% Scout participation.	☐	
#8	Product Sale: Unit participates in at least one council-sponsored fundraising program (Popcorn or Scout Cards). Have an average of 50% Scout participation.	☐	
#9	Friends of Scouting: Annually the unit holds a Family FOS presentation from a Council representative.	☐	
#10	Budgeting & Planning: Unit leadership (including the PLC for Troops) conducts an annual planning conference and develops an annual budget.	☐
